Founded by Ancione Casoni in 1814 in the town of Modena in Italy's Emilia Romagna region, Casoni is considered one of the oldest continually operated distilleries in Italy. With recipes that date back well over 200 years, Casoni has continued to make high quality distillates and infusions through its now vast network of sources for the botanicals it uses. The results are excellent, balanced liqueurs that can easily be quaffed in an Apertivo (before the meal), a Digestif (after the meal), or, as is especially apparent from the first two selections, made into a delicious spritz that can be enjoyed at any time. CASONI 1814 L'APERTIVO

Notes of Citrus peel and Lemon Oil balanced with a subtle quinine bitterness and hints of warm spice, hisbiscus flowers, and candied cherries.

CASONI 1814 BITTER

Similar Citrus and floral notes to the L'Apertivo, augmented with bold notes of licorice, cedar, brown baking spices, cherry kirsch, mind and quinine.

AMARO CASONI HERITAGE

A long held recipe of the Casoni family produced via traditional infusion of botanicals, intense bitter persistence, while keeping a dried fruit, citrus and spiced side, the most bitter of these liqueurs, with traditional tasting notes of cacao and cinnamon.
